

CHAPTER 69

PARKING REGULATIONS

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69.01 PARK ADJACENT TO CURB. No person shall stand or park a vehicle in a roadway other than parallel with the edge of the roadway headed in the direction of lawful traffic movement and with the right-hand wheels of the vehicle within eighteen (18) inches of the curb or edge of the roadway except as hereinafter provided in the case of angle parking and vehicles parked on the left-hand side of one-way streets.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 321.361)

69.02 PARK ADJACENT TO CURB - ONE-WAY STREET. No person shall stand or park a vehicle on the left-hand side of a one-way street other than parallel with the edge of the roadway headed in the direction of lawful traffic movement and with the left-hand wheels of the vehicle within eighteen (18) inches of the curb or edge of the roadway except as hereinafter provided in the case of angle parking.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 321.361)

69.03 ANGLE PARKING. Angle or diagonal parking is permitted only in the following locations:

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 321.361)

1. Greene Street, from Reynolds Street to Lawler Street, with the parking angle reduced to 35° to facilitate backing into the lane of traffic on said street;
2. Williams Street, on the south side, from Reynolds Street to Lawler Street; and, on the north side, from Reynolds Street east to the alley;
3. Wilson Street, on the south side, from Park Street to the east line of Grandview Drive extended;
4. East Greene Street, on the north side, from Lawler Street to 83 feet east of North Street;
5. East Greene Street, on the south side, from Lawler Street to 237 feet east of the alley.
6. East Williams Street, on the north and south sides, from Lawler Street east to the alley;
7. East Tilden Street, on the north side, from Lawler Street east to the alley;
8. Lawler Street, on the west side, from Tilden Street to Greene Street;
9. Reynolds Street, on the east side, from Greene Street south to the alley;
10. Reynolds Street, on the east side, from Tilden Street north to the alley;
11. Ogden Street, on the west side, from Tilden Street to Post Street.

12. East Tilden Street, on the south side, beginning 125 feet from the NW corner of Block 2 Ellis & Co. 1st Addition and continuing eastward for 118 feet.

69.04 ANGLE PARKING - MANNER. Upon those streets or portions of streets which have been signed or marked for angle parking, no person shall park or stand a vehicle other than at an angle to the curb or edge of the roadway or in the center of the roadway as indicated by such signs and markings. No part of any vehicle, or the load thereon, when parked within a diagonal parking district, shall extend into the roadway more than a distance of sixteen (16) feet when measured at right angles to the adjacent curb or edge of roadway.

69.05 PARKING FOR CERTAIN PURPOSES ILLEGAL. No person shall park a vehicle upon public property for more than 48 hours, unless otherwise limited under the provisions of this chapter, or for any of the following principal purposes:

1. Sale. Displaying such vehicle for sale;
2. Repairing. For lubricating, repairing or for commercial washing of such vehicle except such repairs as are necessitated by an emergency;
3. Advertising. Displaying advertising;
4. Merchandise Sales. Selling merchandise from such vehicle except in a duly established market place or when so authorized or licensed under this Code of Ordinances.

69.06 PARKING PROHIBITED. No one shall stop, stand, or park a vehicle except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with the directions of a peace officer or traffic control device, in any of the following places:

1. Crosswalk. On a crosswalk.
(Code of Iowa, Sec. 321.358[5])
2. Center Parkway. On the center parkway or dividing area of any divided street.
(Code of Iowa, Sec. 321.236[1])
3. Mailboxes. Within twenty (20) feet on either side of a mailbox which is so placed and so equipped as to permit the depositing of mail from vehicles on the roadway.

4. Sidewalks. On or across a sidewalk.
(Code of Iowa, Sec. 321.358[1])
5. Driveway. In front of a public or private driveway.
(Code of Iowa, Sec. 321.358[2])
6. Intersection. Within an intersection or within ten (10) feet of an intersection of any street or alley.
(Code of Iowa, Sec. 321.358[3])
7. Fire Hydrant. Within five (5) feet of a fire hydrant.
(Code of Iowa, Sec. 321.358[4])
8. Stop Sign or Signal. Within ten (10) feet upon the approach to any flashing beacon, stop or yield sign, or traffic control signal located at the side of a roadway.
(Code of Iowa, Sec. 321.358[6])
9. Railroad Crossing. Within fifty (50) feet of the nearest rail of a railroad crossing, except when parked parallel with such rail and not exhibiting a red light.

- 10. Fire Station.** Within twenty (20) feet of the driveway entrance to any fire station and on the side of a street opposite the entrance to any fire station within seventy-five (75) feet of said entrance when properly sign posted.

- 11. Excavations.** Alongside or opposite any street excavation or obstruction when such stopping, standing or parking would obstruct traffic.

- 12. Double Parking.** On the roadway side of any vehicle stopped or parked at the edge or curb of a street.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 321.358[11])

- 13. Hazardous Locations.** When, because of restricted visibility or when standing or parked vehicles would constitute a hazard to moving traffic, or when other traffic conditions require, the Council may cause curbs to be painted with a yellow color and erect no parking or standing signs.

- 14. Churches, Nursing Homes and Other Buildings.** A space of fifty (50) feet is hereby reserved at the side of the street in front of any theatre, auditorium, hotel having more than twenty-five (25) sleeping rooms, hospital, nursing home, taxicab stand, bus depot, church, or other building where large assemblages of people are being held, within which space, when clearly marked as such, no motor vehicle shall be left standing, parked or stopped except in taking on or discharging passengers or freight, and then only for such length of time as is necessary for such purpose.

- 15. Alleys.** No person shall park a vehicle within an alley in such a manner or under such conditions as to leave available less than ten (10) feet of the width of the roadway for the free movement of vehicular traffic, and no person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle within an alley in such a position as to block the driveway entrance to any abutting property. The provisions of this subsection shall not apply to a vehicle parked in any alley which is eighteen (18) feet wide or less; provided said vehicle is parked to deliver goods or services.

- 16. Ramps.** In front of a curb cut or ramp which is located on public or private property in a manner which blocks access to the curb cut or ramp.

- 17. In More Than One Space.** In any designated parking space so that any part of the vehicle occupies more than one such space or protrudes beyond the markings designating such space.

- 18. Boulevards.** No person shall park a vehicle on a boulevard area in any residential area except on paved area at an authorized curb cut. All gravel parking areas with an authorized curb cut must be paved with concrete by September 1, 2016. Deteriorated asphalt and concrete parking areas may be repaired with asphalt or concrete.

- A. Any person violating the parking the parking prohibition shall be issued a citation setting forth the nature of the violation that has occurred. The citation shall state that the offender has 72 hours in which to respond to

the citation indicating admission or denial of the violation charged. A service fee of \$50.00 shall be assessed to the person served with the citation.

- B. A violator of this subsection shall reimburse the City for any damage to the curb caused by the violator. The violator shall also pay to the City a fine equal to \$10.00 per foot lineal measurement for the length of the area of boulevard damaged by the violator.

69.07 PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES PARKING. The following regulations shall apply to the establishment and use of persons with disabilities parking spaces.

- 1. **Establishment.** Persons with disabilities parking spaces shall be established and designated in accordance with Chapter 321L of the *Code of Iowa* and Iowa Administrative Code, 661-18. No unauthorized person shall establish any on-street persons with disabilities parking space without first obtaining Council approval.
- 2. **Improper Use.** The following uses of a persons with disabilities parking space, located on either public or private property, constitute improper use of a persons with disabilities parking permit, which is a violation of this Code of Ordinances.

 - A. Use by an operator of a vehicle not displaying a persons with disabilities parking permit;
 - B. Use by an operator of a vehicle displaying a persons with disabilities parking permit but not being used by a person issued a permit or being transported in accordance with Section 321L.2[1b] of the *Code of Iowa*.
 - C. Use by a vehicle in violation of the rules adopted under Section 321L.8 of the *Code of Iowa*.
- 3. **Wheelchair Parking Cones.** No person shall use or interfere with a wheelchair parking cone in violation of the following:
 - A. A person issued a persons with disabilities parking permit must comply with the requirements of Section 321L.2A(1) of the *Code of Iowa* when utilizing a wheelchair parking cone.
 - B. A person shall not interfere with a wheelchair parking cone which is properly placed under the provisions of Section 321L2A(1) of the *Code of Iowa*.

69.08 NO PARKING ZONES. No one shall stop, stand or park a vehicle in any of the following specifically designated no parking zones except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with the direction of a peace officer or traffic control signal.

- 1. Arthur F. Brandt Drive adjacent to Lull's Park from Wilson Street to Hill Street;
- 2. Bancroft Street on either side at the intersection with West Tilden Street to a point 35 feet from the stop sign line;
- 3. Boody Street on either side at the intersection with West Tilden Street to a point 35 feet from the stop sign line;

4. East Greene Street on the south side from the designated diagonal parking area to Lybrand Street;
5. West Greene Street on the north side from Bancroft Street to Ogden Street;
6. Hardin Drive on either side from Military Road to Oak Drive;
7. Lawler Street on the west side from Hardin Drive to Tilden Street;
8. Lawler Street on the east side from Military Road to Tilden Street;
9. Lawler Street from Greene Street to north corporate line;
10. Lybrand Street on both sides from Village Street to northeast corporate line;
11. Lybrand Street on the north side from Maple Street to Village Street;
12. Maple Street on both sides from Military Road to Lybrand Street;
13. Maple Street on the east side from Greene Street to North Street;
14. Military Road on the south side from Post Street to Lawler Street;
15. Military Road on either side from Lawler Street to Hardin Drive;
16. Oak Drive on the west side from Hardin Drive to Lybrand Street;
17. Oak Drive on the east side from Hardin Drive to Wilson Street;
18. Ogden Street on either side at the intersection with West Tilden Street to a point 35 feet from the stop sign line;
19. Ogden Street from Greene Street to Stoneman Street;
20. Post Street on the south side from West Street to Lawler Street;
21. Reynolds Street on either side at the intersection with West Tilden Street to a point 35 feet from the stop sign line;
22. Summer Street on the east side from Tilden Street to a point 100 feet south of the intersection;
23. East Tilden Street on the south side from Summer Street to Lybrand Street;
24. West Tilden Street on the north side from the west corporate line to Lawler Street;
25. West Tilden Street on the south side from the west corporate line to Lawler Street;
26. West Street on either side at the intersection with West Tilden Street to a point 35 feet from the stop sign line;
27. East Williams Street on the south side from the alley east of Lawler Street to Lybrand Street;
28. Wilson Street on either side from Oak Drive to Arthur F. Brandt Drive.

29. South Ogden on the east side from West Post Street to West Tilden Street.

30. Cheryl Street on East side from Lybrand Street to Oak Street.

31. West Post on North side from South Ogden Street to South Boody.

69.09 ALL NIGHT PARKING PROHIBITED.

1. No person, except physicians or other persons on emergency calls, shall park a vehicle on any street or alley for a period of time longer than thirty (30) minutes between the hours of two o'clock (2:00) a.m. and six o'clock (6:00) a.m. of any day during the period of time from November 1 to April 1.

2. No person, except physicians or other persons on emergency calls, shall park a vehicle on the west side of S. Ogden Street between Post and Tilden Streets for a period of time longer than thirty (30) minutes between the hours of twelve o'clock (12:00) midnight and six o'clock (6:00) a.m. of any day.

69.10 OVERSIZE VEHICLE PARKING LIMITED. No person shall park a motor home, motor truck, trailer, semi-trailer, truck tractor, boat or boat trailer or other motor vehicle with trailer attached in violation of the following regulations. The provisions of this section shall not apply to pick-up, light delivery or panel delivery trucks.

1. **Business District.** Excepting only when such vehicles are actually engaged in the delivery or receiving of merchandise or cargo within the prohibited area, no person shall park or leave unattended such vehicle, on any of the following designated streets. When actually receiving or delivering merchandise or cargo such vehicle shall be stopped or parked in a manner which will not interfere with other traffic.

A. Lawler Street from Greene Street to Post Street;

B. Greene Street from Lawler Street to Reynolds Street.

2. **Livestock.** No such vehicle containing livestock, carcasses of dead animals or parts or products of dead animals shall be parked on any street, alley or highway for a period of time of more than thirty (30) minutes.

3. No person shall park any motor home, motor truck, trailer, semi-trailer, truck tractor, boat or boat trailer or other motor vehicle with trailer attached which exceeds 72 inches in width and/or 18 feet in length on any street or alley between sunrise and sunset for a longer period than 30 minutes, except for loading or unloading purposes, or while in the actual process of being loaded or unloaded or making necessary minor repairs. Persons demonstrating a special need for a longer period of parking for a limited time may request a temporary waiver of this section from the Chief of Police or his designee.

69.11 PARKING RESTRICTED.

1. No person except residents living along the street shall park a vehicle on Post Street between Ogden Street and Boody Street between the hours of seven-thirty o'clock (7:30) a.m. and three o'clock (3:00) p.m. on school days.

2. No person shall park a vehicle in the three spaces directly in front of the Postville Child Learning Center on S. Ogden Street for a period of time longer than ten (10) minutes between the hours of six o'clock (6:00) a.m. and six o'clock (6:00) p.m. of any day.
3. No persons except residents of the Postville Community Housing Complex who have obtained a permit from the Postville Police Department shall park a vehicle on the north side of East Greene Street in the area adjoining Lot 1 of Lot 3 and Lot 2 of Lot 3 in the Northeast Quarter of the Southwest Quarter (NE $\frac{1}{4}$ - SW $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section 33, Township 96 North, Range 6 West of the 5th P.M., Allamakee County, Iowa.
4. No person shall park a vehicle on Boody Street between the hours of seven o'clock (7:00) a.m. and nine o'clock (9:00) a.m. on school days.

69.12 PRIORITY SNOW REMOVAL ROUTE.

1. Whenever the Mayor or the Public Works Director finds, on the basis of falling snow, sleet, freezing rain or the forecast of accumulations of snow or ice, that weather conditions have created or are likely to create hazardous road and driving conditions which will impede or are likely to impede movement of fire, health, police, emergency or other vital vehicular traffic, the Mayor or Public Works Director may declare that snow removal on Priority One Streets shall begin and prohibit parking or stopping of vehicles on designated Priority One Snow Removal Routes. While the snow removal is in effect, no person shall park, abandon or leave unattended any vehicle upon any Priority One Snow Removal Route or portion of such Route. Each street designated as a Priority One Snow Removal Route by the Council shall be marked with a signs displaying the words "No Parking During Snow Removal."
2. The ban on parking on the Priority One Snow Removal Route shall continue from its proclamation through the duration of the snow or ice storm and until the proper authority issues notice that the snow removal on Priority One Streets is at an end. The public shall be notified by announcement over radio stations KOEL, Oelwein, Iowa, KNEI, Waukon, Iowa, and KADR, Elkader, Iowa, when snow removal begins and is concluded. The parking prohibition shall not go into effect until two hours after the ban has been declared as described in this section, and it shall terminate immediately upon announcement that snow removal on Priority One Streets is at an end.
3. Priority One Streets in the City are as follows:
 - A. Greene Street between Lawler Street and Maple Street;
 - B. Maple Street between Greene Street and Tilden Street;
 - C. Tilden Street between Maple Street and Lybrand Street;
 - D. Oak Drive for its entire length from the intersection of Tilden Street and Lybrand Street to Hardin Drive;
 - E. Hardin Drive from Highways 18 and 52 to east of the entrance to the Good Samaritan Center.

4. When it is declared that snow removal operations are to begin, it is unlawful for the driver of any vehicle to impede or block traffic on the designated Priority One Snow Removal Routes.

69.13 CONTROLLED ACCESS FACILITIES. Parking restrictions on controlled access facilities are as specified in Chapter 140 of this Code of Ordinances.
